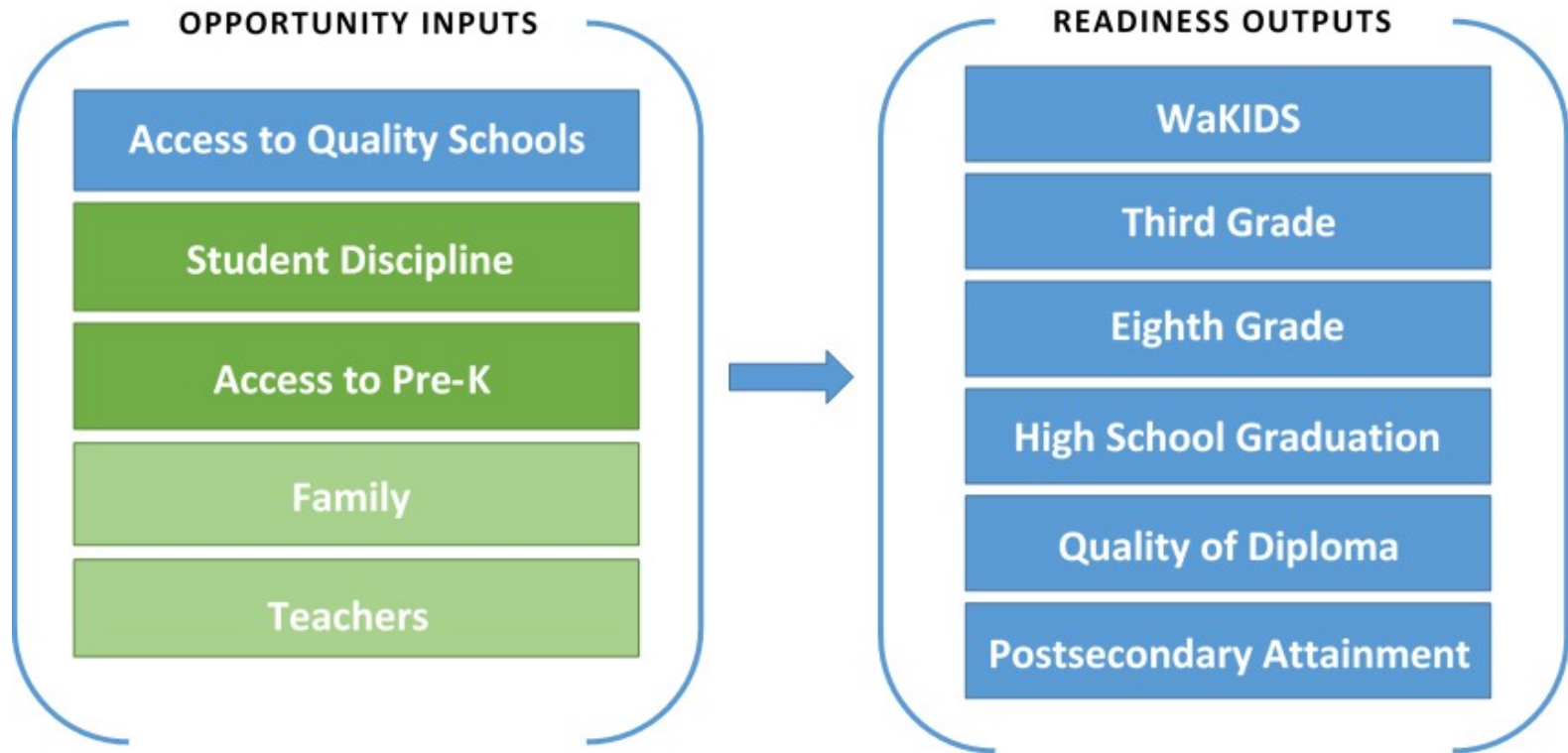





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Educational System Inputs and Outputs

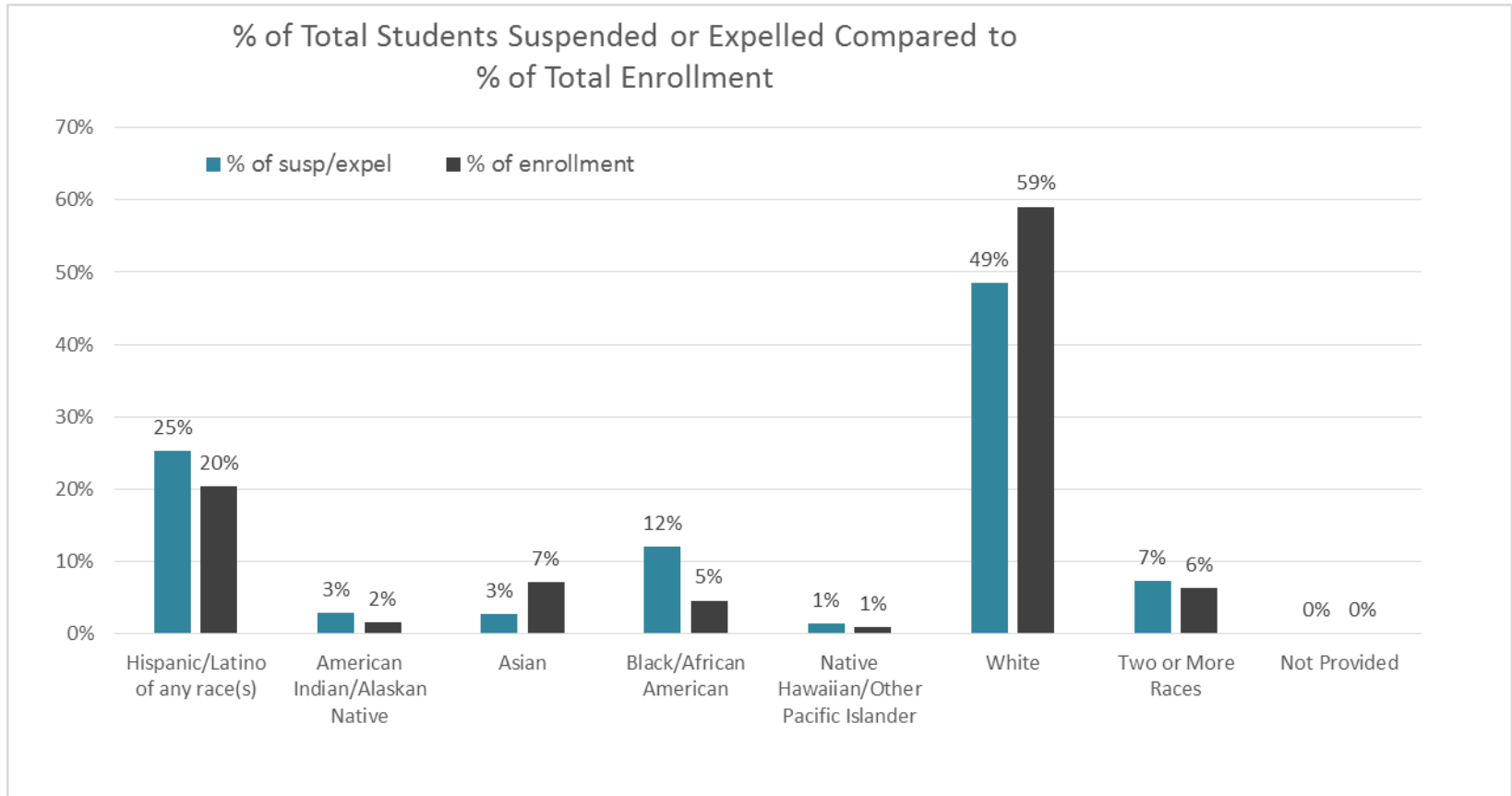
Student Discipline Indicator



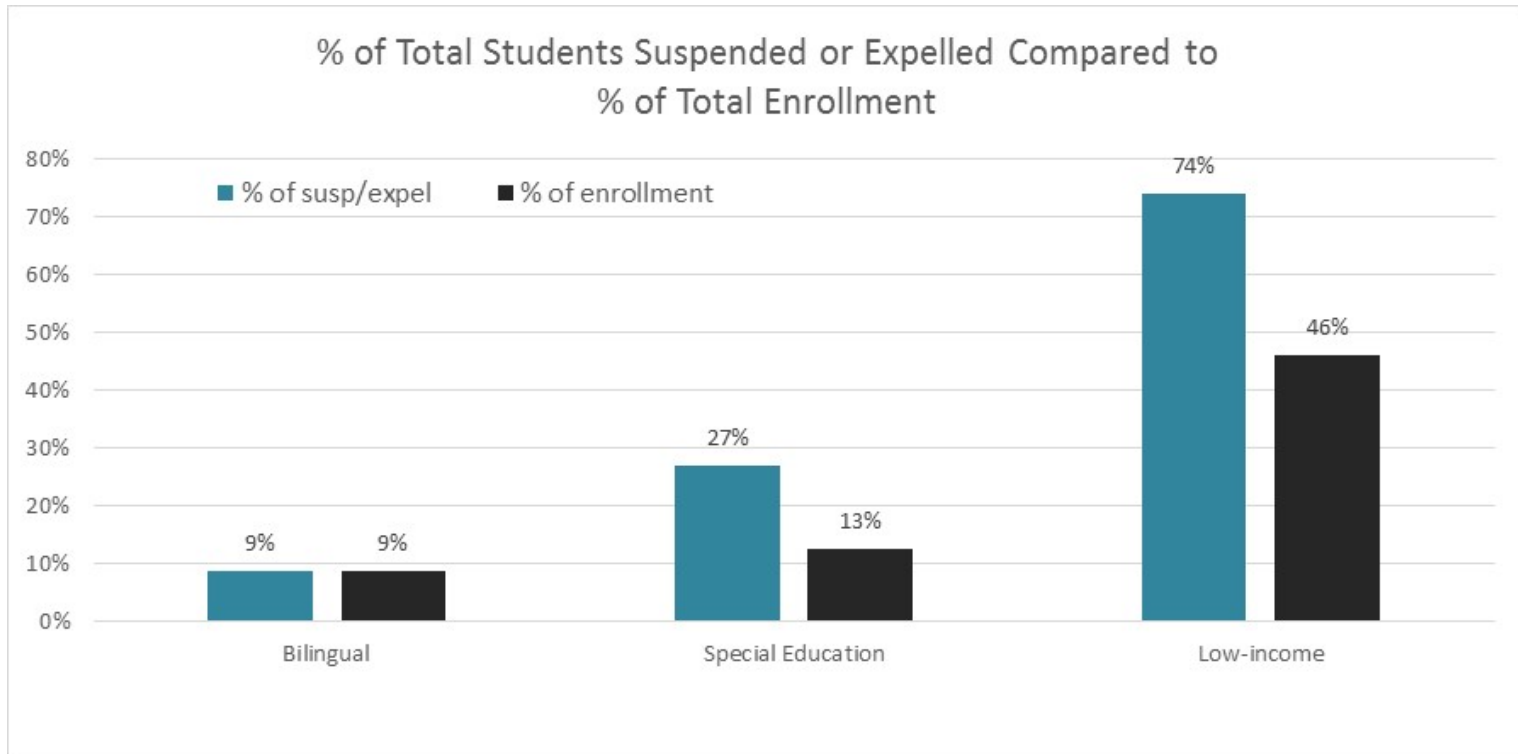
- **Primary indicator will be Proportionality in Discipline Practices**
 - ✦ Goals would be set for each student group (% of suspensions/expulsions equal to % of enrollment)
 - ✦ Goals will be set in 2016 report when enough years of data are available
- **Secondary indicator length of suspension/expulsion**
 - ✦ Descriptive indicator to inform understanding of lost educational opportunity
- **Future refinements and additional secondary indicators may be added, particularly as new behavior data becomes available**



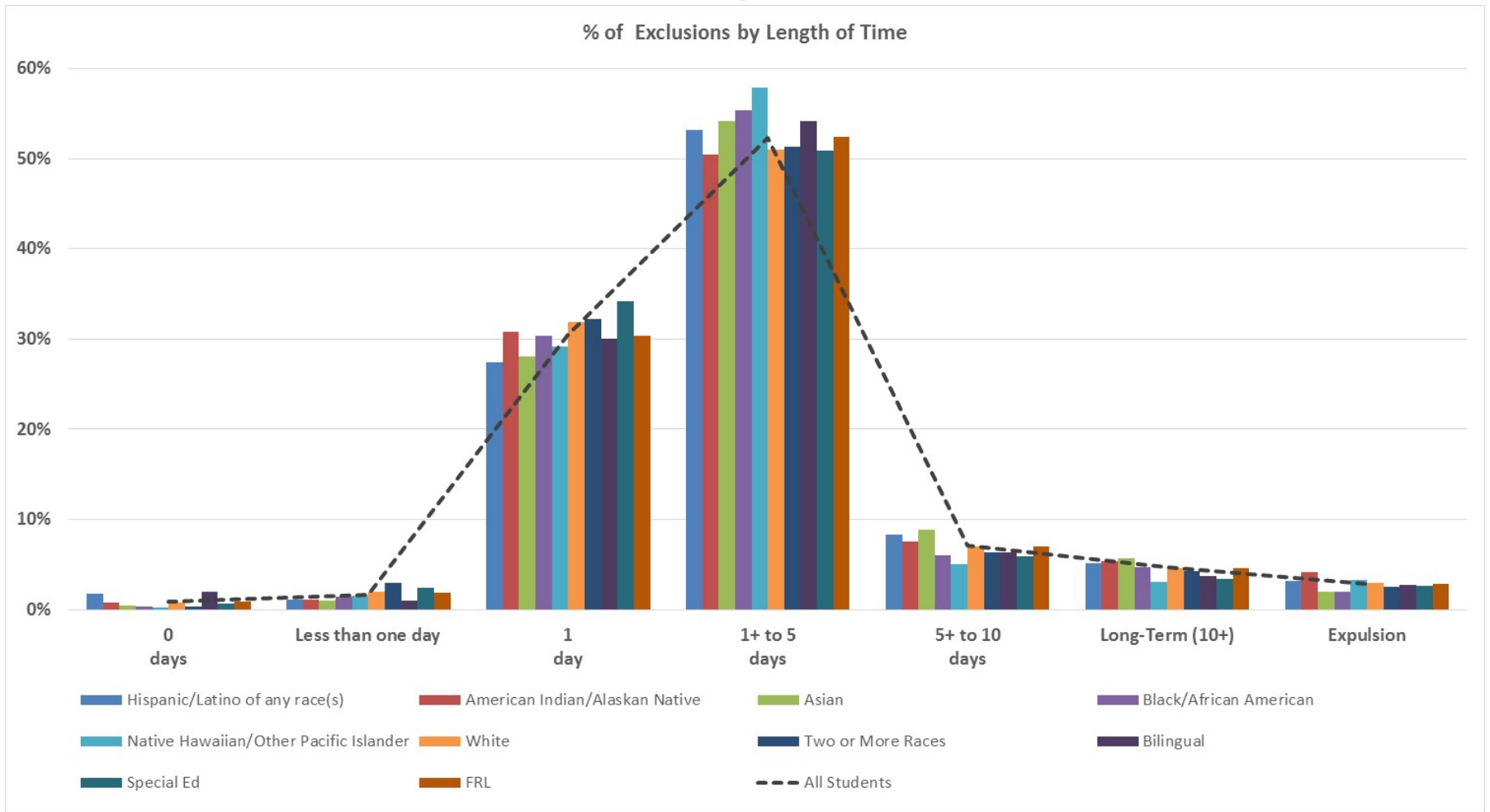
Discipline Disproportionality (2012-2013)

Access to Pre-K



- Percentage of 3 and 4 year olds that are enrolled in pre-school
- Currently recommended as a secondary indicator under “Kindergarten Readiness”
 - ✦ Use American Community Survey data—may require different goal setting methodology (three year rolling average)
 - ✦ Goal setting in next report: access for all students in need (low-income, 200% of federal poverty level)



Language Acquisition



- In previous 5491 report, recommended incorporate in 4th (3rd) grade and 8th grade proficiency indicators
 - ✦ % of students in K-3 that transition, % of students in K-8 that transition.
- Revision: graduation rate of Former ELL students as secondary indicator under postsecondary readiness
 - ✦ Use until new ELL indicator developed



Adequate Growth



- In previous 5491 report, student growth percentile incorporated into the 8th grade High School Readiness indicator
 - ✦ Not well suited for large population analysis
- Revision: Percentage of students meeting Adequate Growth Percentile in 4th and 6th grade
 - ✦ Goals will be set once adequate growth available
 - ✦ Explore measure in next year
