

Required Action Process



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After a district is in required action for 3 years, what happens?



Analysis of Data

- District no longer has a school on the PLA list (Priority-lowest 5% tier)
- The schools that were on the PLA list have a positive performance trend for the past three years.
- Progress in closing gaps.

YES →

- Schools on the PLA list (Priority-lowest 5% tier) have made recent and significant progress
- Projected progress would result in exit from the PLA list within three years

NO →

- Schools on the PLA list (Priority-lowest 5% tier) have NOT made recent and significant progress
- Projected progress would NOT result in exit from the PLA list within three years

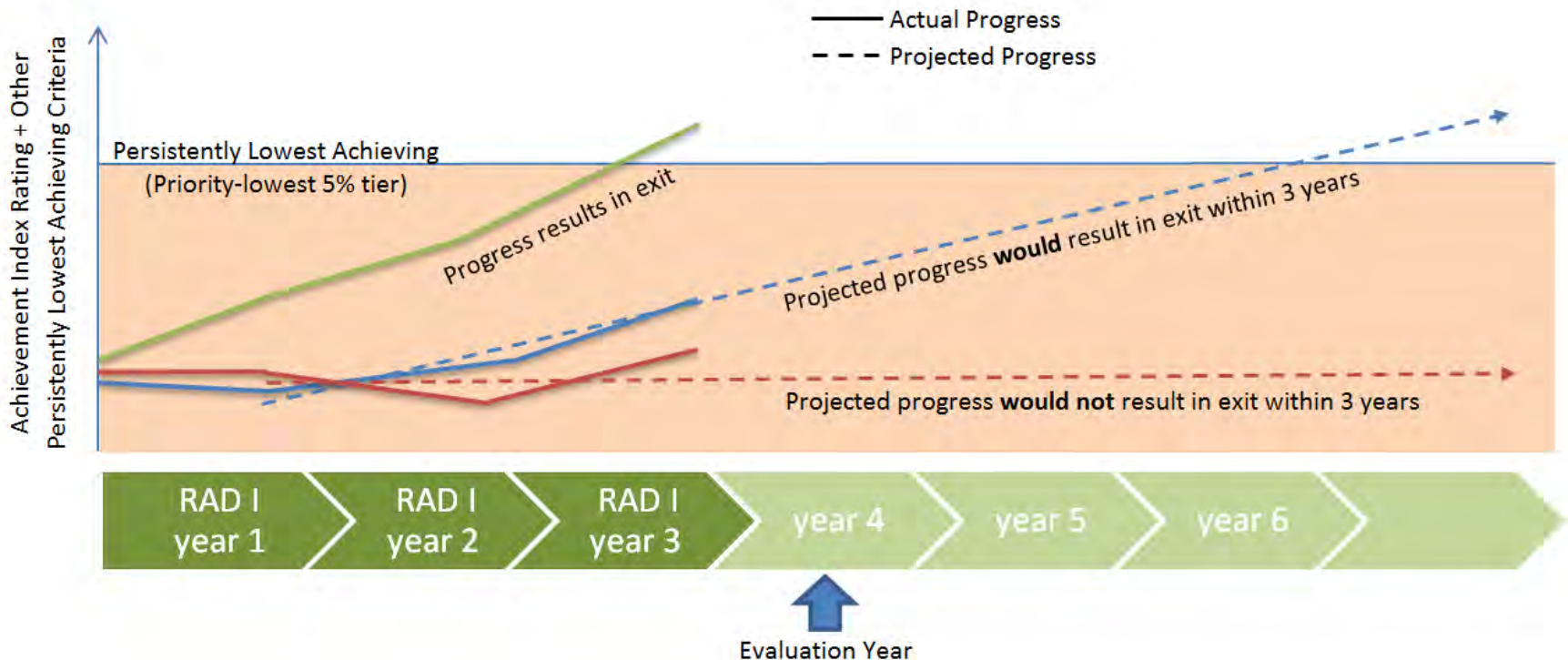
Inform the Education Accountability Oversight Committee of findings prior to designation.



Recent and Significant Progress: Assignment to Level II Required Action

Today:



- Consider releasing districts from required action status or designate new required action districts, based on Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) recommendations.
 - ✦ 4 Districts in SIG Cohort II
 - **Morton SD** – Morton Junior-Senior High School
 - **Onalaska SD** – Onalaska Middle School
 - **Renton SD** – Lakeridge Elementary School
 - **Soap Lake SD** – Soap Lake Middle and Senior High School
- Approve a letter to the Education Accountability and System Oversight Committee.
- Approve a CR-102 to modify rules on the deadline for designating Required Action Districts (RADs). (Draft amended rule on page 68 of the packet.)

Next Steps:



- For districts that are recommended by OSPI for release:
 - SBE shall confirm the district has met the requirements and then release the district from the designation.
- For districts that are not recommended by OSPI for release:
 - SBE must determine if the district should stay at Level I or be directed to Level II.
 - SBE must submit findings to the Education Accountability System Oversight Committee to provide an opportunity for review and comment.
 - If re-designated Level I
 - Submit a new or revised required action plan to the SBE for approval.
 - If designated Level II
 - Needs assessment and review within 90 days and a Level II required action plan based on the needs assessment.
