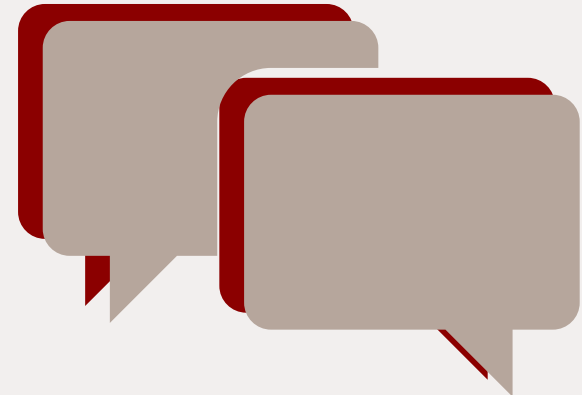

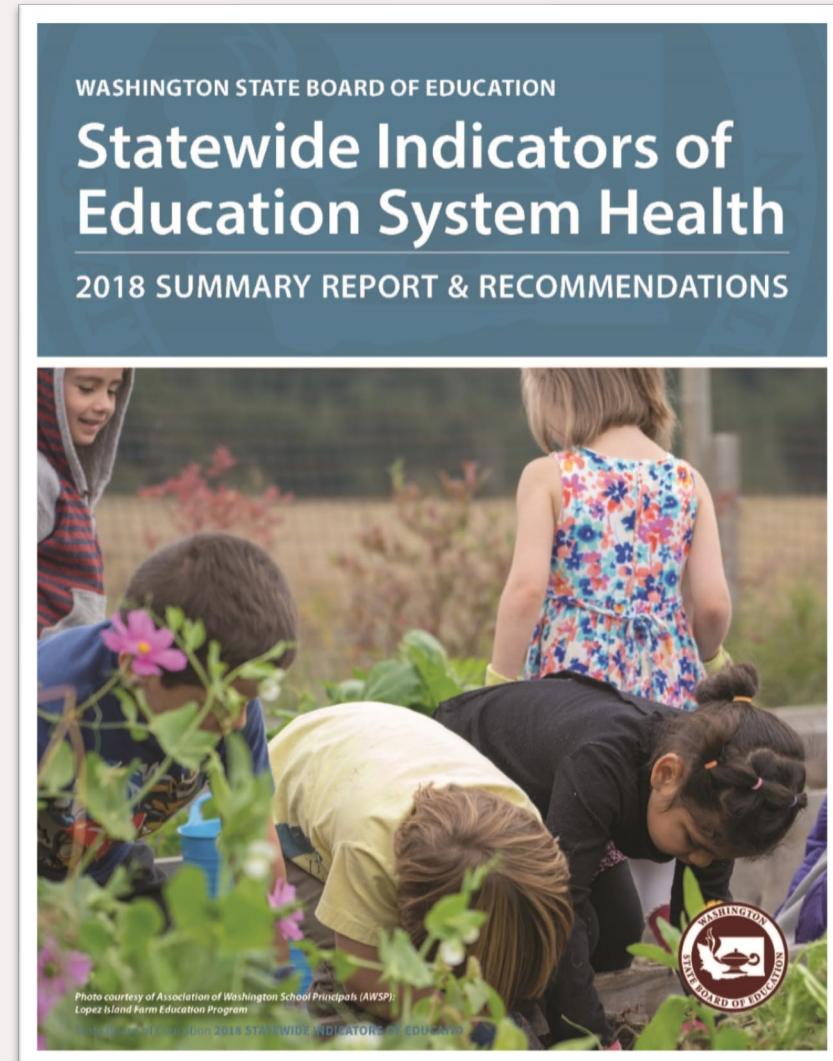

2020 SBE Reporting Requirements – System Health


- **Statewide Indicators of Educational System Health (RCW 28A.150.550) – Due December 1, 2020**

Report on specific defined metrics with assistance from other education agencies and organizations. Recommend SBE combine with SBE Annual Report and Strategic Plan Progress Report.



2020 SBE Reporting Requirements – Charter Public Schools

- **Annual Charter School Report (RCW 28A.710.250) – Due December 1, 2020.**
The report must include a comparison of the performance of charter school students with the performance of academically, ethnically, and economically comparable groups of students in other public schools. In addition, the annual report must include the state board of education's assessment of the successes, challenges, and areas for improvement in meeting the purposes of this chapter, including the board's assessment of the sufficiency of funding for charter schools, the efficacy of the formula for authorizer funding, and any suggested changes in state law or policy necessary to strengthen the state's charter schools.

- **PESB/SBE Joint Report (RCW 28A.410.210 (11)) – Due October 15, 2020.**

Progress the boards have made and the obstacles they have encountered, individually and collectively, in the work of achieving the goals set out in RCW 28A.150.210.



- Include additional school quality indicators to address school climate and culture, access to effective, experienced, and appropriately credentialed educators, and disproportionate discipline in the state accountability system. (SBE)
- Advocacy & Systems Development
 - Implementing a culturally responsive curriculum (PESB and SBE)
 - Professional Development for Paraeducators (PESB)
 - Micro-credentials and professional learning
 - Creating additional flexibility in state diploma requirements (SBE)

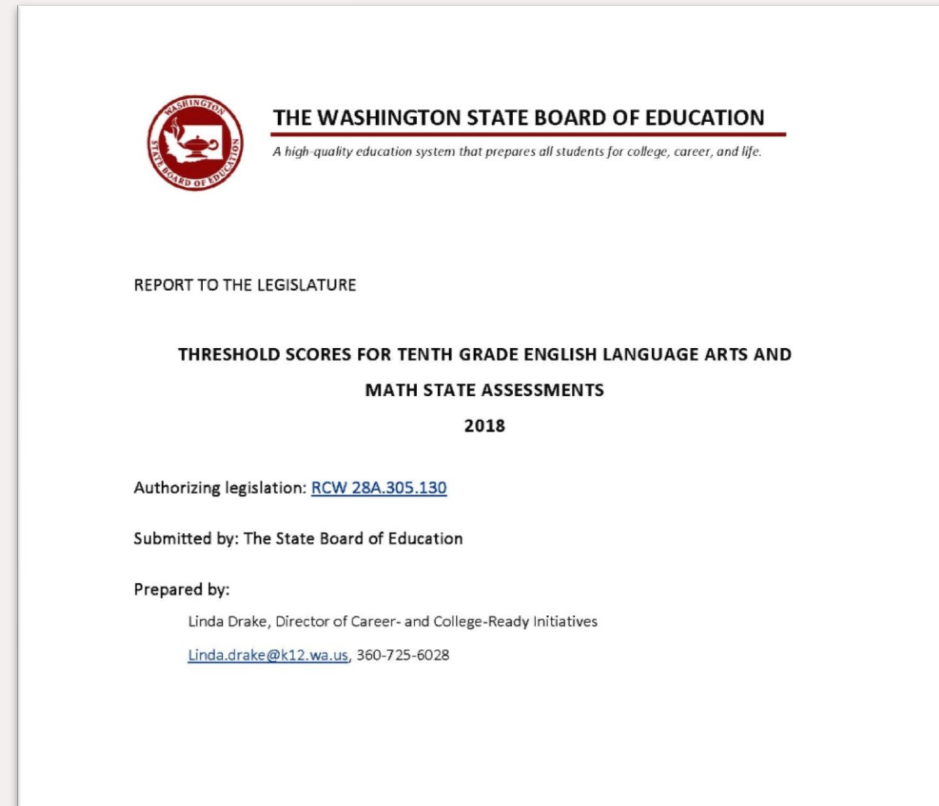

2020 SBE Reporting Requirements – Student Assessment System

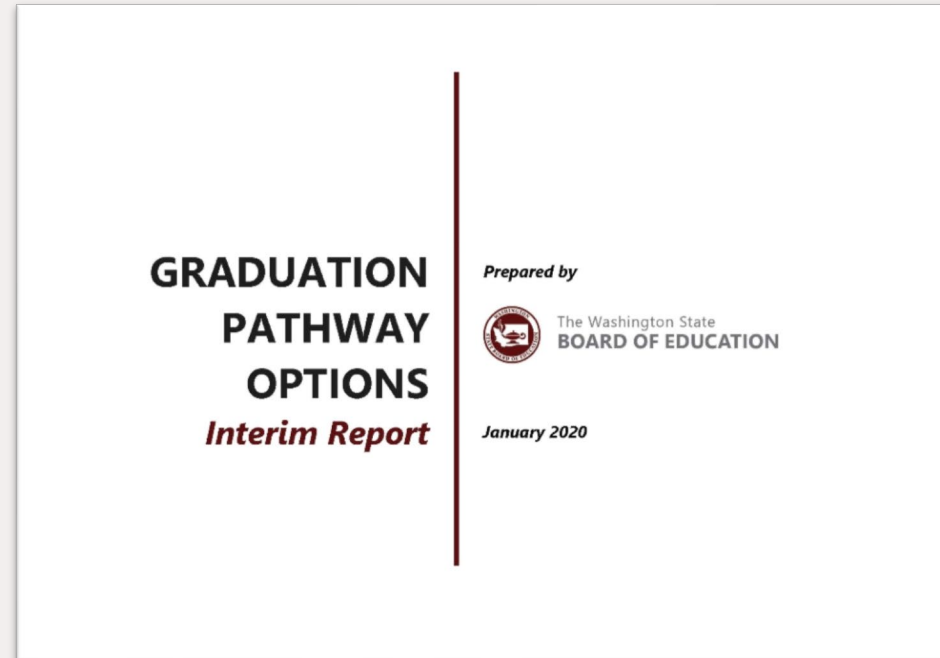
- **Annual Statewide Student Assessment System Report (with OSPI; RCW 28A.300.041) – Due December 1, 2020.**
Regarding the assessment system, including a cost analysis of any changes and costs to expand availability and use of instructionally supportive formative assessments.



2020 SBE Reporting Requirements – Graduation Pathway Options

- **Graduation Pathway Options Interim Report (RCW 28A.655.260) - Due August 1, 2020**

Report on survey of interested parties regarding what additional graduation pathways should be added to the existing graduation pathways identified in RCW 28A.655.250 and whether modifications should be made to any of the existing pathways.



2020 SBE Reporting Requirements – Mastery-Based Learning Workgroup

- **Mastery-based Learning Work Group Interim Report* (E2SHB 1599) – Due December 1, 2020.**

Charter School Rulemaking Under Consideration

- Possible changes include the following:
 - Modifying how the fee from a charter school to charter school authorizer is calculated;
 - Streamlining of approval process and timelines for school districts to apply to the State Board of Education to become charter school authorizers;
 - Changing the title of Chapter 180-19 WAC from “Charter Schools” to “Charter School Authorizers;”
 - Clarifying how the State Board of Education counts the number of available slots for charter schools to be authorized; and,
 - Other issues as identified during review.
