

EVERETT PUBLIC SCHOOLS PATHWAY TO MEDICAL PROFESSIONS

PATHWAY FRAMEWORK

(1) Industry Bridge Courses

Third year science courses aligned to standards, graduation requirements, workplace professional practice, and as appropriate, post-secondary credit

(2) Work-Based Learning

Internships, job shadows, and community service in partnership with labor, industry, government and higher education

(3) Extended Learning

After school clubs and school-based mentoring

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Everett Public Schools **Pathway to Medical Professions** integrates content and workplace practices providing foundation for student success in their pursuit to high demand healthcare careers such as medical assistants, primary care nurses and physicians, and behavioral health counselors. After completing core high school coursework, students enter the pathway and gain the academic, technical and workplace knowledge and skills allowing for seamless continuation to post-secondary certificate, Associate, and/or Bachelor degree programs. Students then can transition to the workplace or continue on to pursue graduate programs.

Partnering with industry experts, the core program staff include Career and Technology Education (CTE) certified science teachers. On an annual basis, the program will support up to 400 students from Everett Public Schools as well as neighboring school districts including Lake Stevens, Lakewood, Marysville and Monroe School Districts. The program will serve as a pilot to be replicated in regions with healthcare concentration.

COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Everett Public Schools **Pathway to Medical Professions** is being developed in partnership with a diversity of community organizations including Everett and Edmonds Community College, UW Bothell Nursing & Health Studies Program, WSU North Puget Sound & Elson S. Floyd College of Medicine, The Everett Clinic, Providence Everett, Snohomish Health District, Snohomish County Medical Society, and Verdant Health Commission.

THE FACILITY

Everett Public Schools **Pathway to Medical Professions** will be housed in the Vocational building at Everett High School. Built in 1912, the school district is seeking **12 million dollars** to modernization the building in becoming a facility that supports collaborative, student-centered and project-based learning. The three-story facility will include *wet laboratory learning spaces* (anatomy, physiology, micro-biology & cell biology), *patient care simulation* (skills room to simulate nursing assistant and phlebotomy training), *informatics lab* (healthcare administration and medical records), *health career center* (mentoring with industry partners), *preparation and collaboration rooms* (space for teachers to collaborate as well as store and prepare real world lab specimens and materials), and *flexible classrooms*.

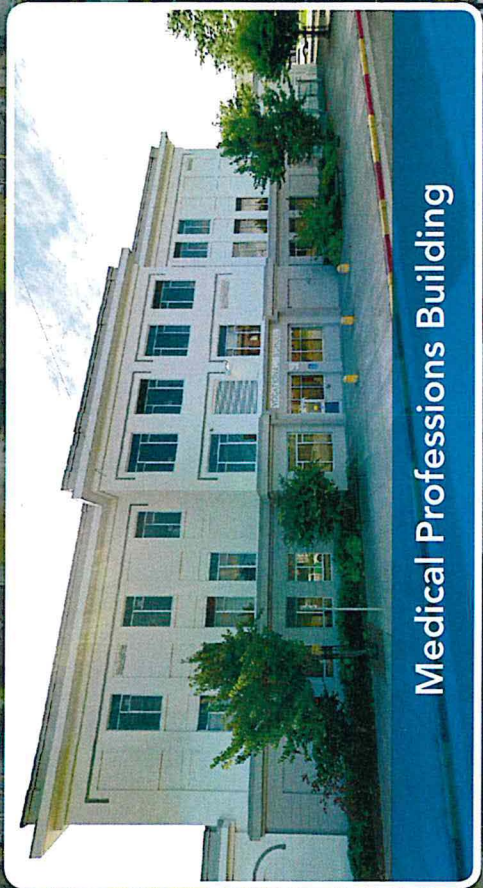
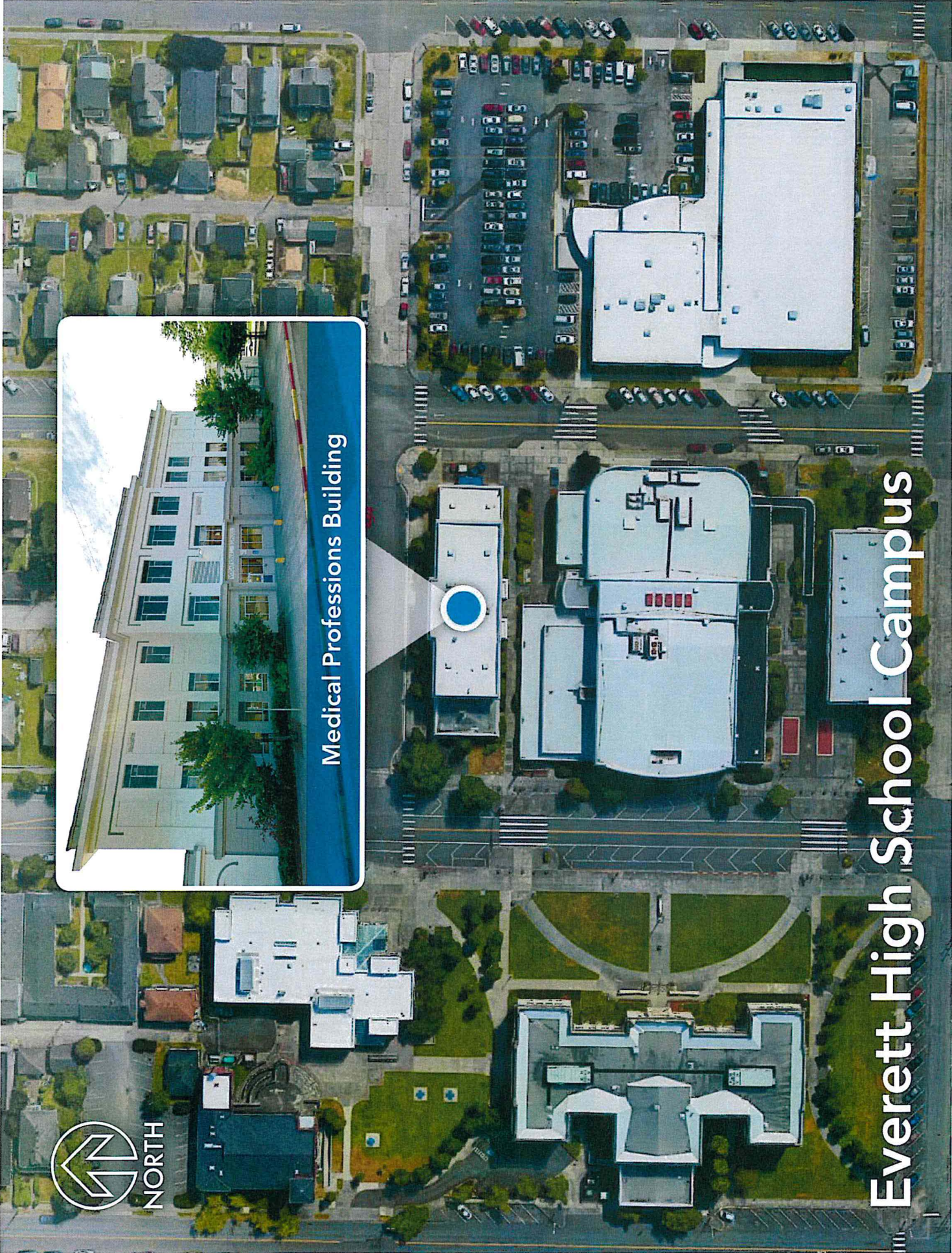

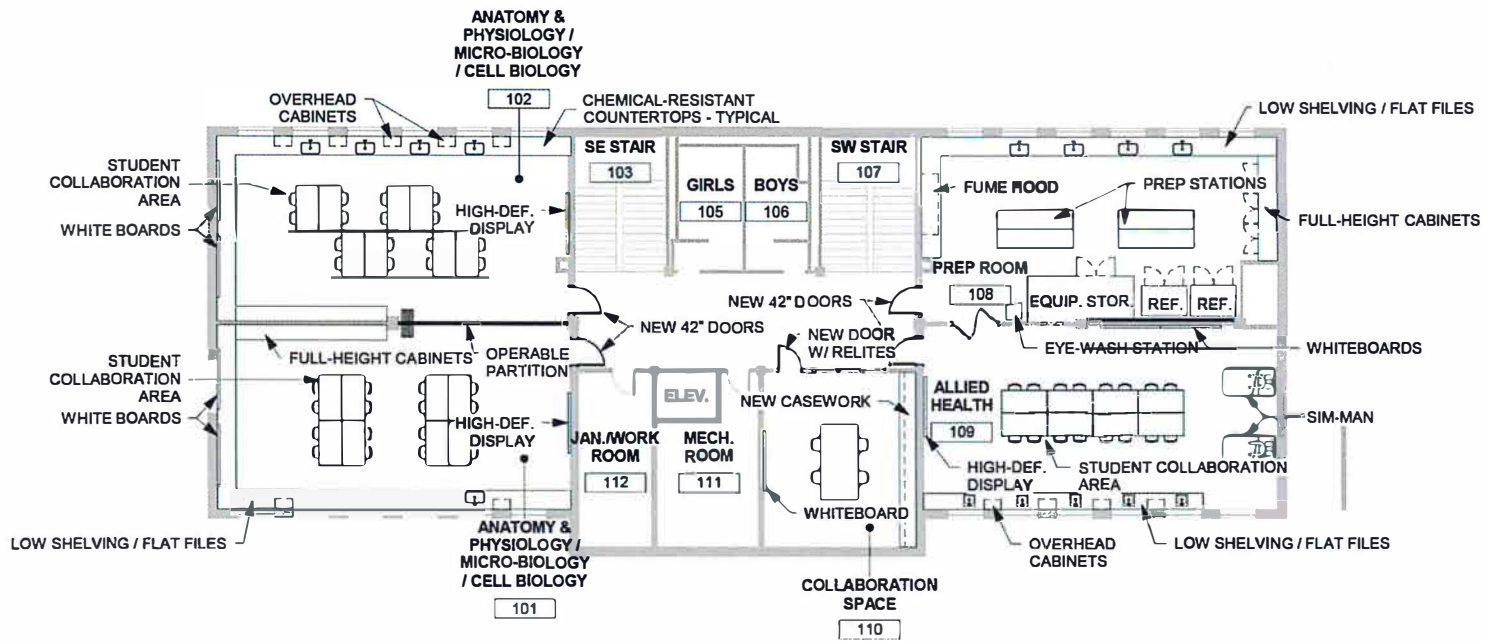
