### Reliance on local levies for basic education

 The McCleary court found that because of historic legislative underfunding, school districts were relying on local levies to supplement state salary allocations for basic education.

• The state's 2013 Report to the Court "skims over the fact that state funding of educator and administrator staff salaries are constitutionally inadequate." -- Supreme Court order, January 2014.

### Legislative Responses

- In response to the Court findings, legislators have offered several proposals with one or more of the following purposes:
  - Reduce, limit and restrict the uses of local M&O levies.
  - Revise the formula for Local Effort Assistance.
  - Generate new state revenue for the purpose of increased salary allocations to districts, whether through an increase in the state levy or a new capital gains tax.
  - Revise the state salary allocation schedule and prescribe methods for raising teacher salaries.
  - Initiate statewide bargaining on K-12 employee benefits.
