### **Motion:**

Moved by Ms. Carpenter, seconded by Ms. Anderson, that Tab 11 be approved to grant waivers to the above-listed school districts for one year, instead of two to three years, due to the three days for staff development funded by the 1999 Legislature. Districts may reapply for waivers after one year. Motion unanimously approved. Ms. Frank and Ms. Henderson were excused.

# INITIAL DISCUSSION OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Tab 12 Proposed Amendments to: WAC 180-79A-223(1) Academic and Experience Requirements for Certification—School nurse, school occupational therapist, school physical therapist and school speech language pathologist or audiologist.

In order to receive certification as a school nurse, individuals must complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN), in addition to holding a valid Washington nurse's license and completing a course which orients them to the role of school nurse. Currently, the rules indicate the BSN must be earned at an institution accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission. The Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education has also gained acceptance as a national accrediting agency for nursing programs. The OSPI School Nurse Advisory Committee has requested that the rules be amended to include this agency as an approved accrediting body for BSN programs leading to certification.

#### Motion:

Moved by Ms. Tolas, seconded by Ms. Anderson, that staff be directed to have the proposed amendment to WAC 180-79A-223(1) reviewed by the Professional Education Advisory Committee (PEAC) and then prepared for public hearing and adoption consideration at the August Board meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Ms. Frank and Ms. Henderson were excused.

#### **REPORT**

Annual Resolution Approving/Disapproving Rules of the Washington
Interscholastic Activities Association (WIAA) for the 1999-2000 School
Year. (A copy of the resolution is available through the State Board office.)

Included in the 1999 amendments to the annual resolution is the following proposed language for the WIAA transfer rule:

Students' whose transfer is the result of participation in a one-year cultural or educational exchange experience—

- a) Students leaving this country for a one-year cultural/educational experience shall file a letter with their district eligibility committee prior to departure and will
  - be eligible at their school of origin upon their return, provided all other rules of eligibility have been met.
- b) Students coming to this country for a one-year cultural/educational experience are eligible in the school in which they have been placed, provided all other rules of eligibility have been met.
- c) In no case will eligibility be extended beyond the four consecutive years

provided for in 18.4, and this exception applies only to students participating in a one year cultural/educational experience in another country. There shall be no evidence that a significant reason for the transfer was to participate in athletics. Students must meet all other WIAA rules of eligibility.

Motion:

Moved by Mr. Gainer, seconded by Ms. Carpenter, that the annual resolution of the WIAA for the 1999-2000 school year, including the proposed transfer rule language, be approved. Motion carried unanimously. Ms. Frank and Ms. Henderson were excused.

# **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

The Board held an executive session to hear arguments in the matter of a certification appeal case.

#### **REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING**

The Board reconvened in regular session to announce its decision on the certification appeal.

### PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION AND CERTIFICATION

Moved by Mr. Gainer, seconded by Ms. Anderson, that the State Board affirm the decision of the Administrative Law Judge and suspend the appellant's certificate for five years. Motion approved by roll call vote: 6 ayes, 2 nays, and 2 excused.
