- Entries submitted by DVD or through YouTube.
- Entries that meet all prerequisites, (explained in your packet) will be linked via the SBE website and YouTube channel.

- Access to either an internet connection (to upload videos) or to a dvd/cd burner.
- Access to either Imovie or Windows movie maker (both free), or some other third party video editing software.
