Criteria for the English Language Acquisition Award based in the 2012-13 WELPA results.

The Board commits to working with OSPI and other partners to support award-winners in sharing strategies and best practices, prior to the announcement of awards.

English Language Acquisition Award – Small Program

- Valid 2012-13 WELPA N-count ≥ 20 and < 100 students
- School met 2012-13 AMAO 1 and AMAO 2 targets
- Identify the top 5 percent (approximate) of schools as below
 - Elementary School median point gain on the WELPA ≥ 36 (n = 20 schools)
 - Middle School median point gain on the WELPA ≥ 28 (n = 4 schools)
 - High School median point gain on the WELPA ≥ 22 (n = 6 schools)
 - Combined Schools (none meet criteria)

English Language Acquisition Award – Large Program

- Valid 2012-13 WELPA N-count ≥ 100 students
- School met 2012-13 AMAO 1 and AMAO 2 targets
- Identify the top 5 percent (approximate) of schools as below
 - Elementary School median point gain on the WELPA ≥ 26 (n = 7 schools)
 - Middle School median point gain on the WELPA ≥ 19 (n = 4 schools)
 - High School median point gain on the WELPA ≥ 17.5 (n = 1 school)
 - Combined Schools (none meet criteria)
