Sharing responsibility to provide a high quality education to all students

In 2005, the state Legislature directed SBE to create a statewide system of accountability to improve student achievement. SBE is considering a system of accountability that includes:

- Clear, appropriate indicators and measurements to monitor progress of the education system.
- A continuous improvement assistance program for *all* Washington schools and districts.
- Criteria to identify schools and districts in which students are successful, need assistance, or consistently fail to meet state standards; and proposals to create targeted state/local partnerships to help improve student achievement.

This spring, SBE is conducting two studies to better understand the policy barriers schools and districts face to improving student achievement and to develop state/local partnership models to help schools and districts boost student achievement.

One of the primary goals of the accountability system is to ensure that schools get the resources they need to improve student achievement. SBE is committed to advocating for our schools and students!
